## How to vote

**Absentee by mail or email:** Madison residents can request an absentee ballot by sending an email to the city clerk ([voting@cityofmadison.com](mailto:voting@cityofmadison.com)). State your name, registered voting address, and include a picture of your ID. Write “send me a ballot” or “email me a ballot.”

**Absentee in person:** The City of Madison has established early voting locations and hours, check out the clerk’s website (<https://bit.ly/2oevall>).

**Absentee on-campus:** 12 to 6 p.m., October 22 - November 2 at Union South and Memorial Union. 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (Same Dates) at the Student Activity Center.

**Vote on November 6th:** Find your polling location, ballot, and registration requirements at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). Look to make sure that you have an appropriate form of ID to bring to the polls. If you are not already registered, bring *proof of residence* to the polls.

## Voting FAQ

**Does my State of Illinois drivers license qualify as a valid photo voter ID?**

No. Only Wisconsin driver’s licenses and IDs, or a U.S. Passport, are considered valid.

**Do I need to re-register every time I move, even if it’s only to a new unit down the hall in the same apartment building?**

Yes, and you can register at the polls on Nov. 6. Bring proof of residence, such as a utility bill, updated WI ID, bank or pay statement, or lease document along with your voter ID.

**My Wiscard has my name and photo on it. Does it count as a valid photo voter ID?**

No. Wiscard does not meet state requirements for voting. However, the university does provide a free voter ID card to any student with a Wiscard. Stop by the Wiscard Office in Union South, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.–5:00 p.m to get one.
