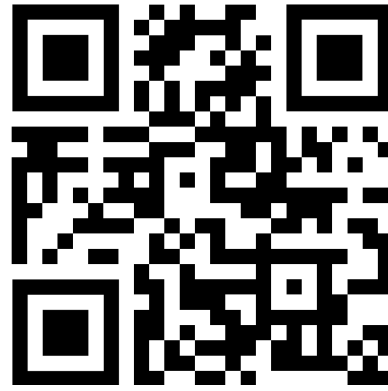

Any graduate student at UW-Madison is welcome to join

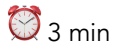

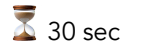
Dues are on a sliding scale based on income

We help you contest and overturn:

- student conduct charges,
- expulsions/suspensions,
- pay decreases & contract violations
- and more!

A union representative can join you in disciplinary meetings, help you file written grievances, and help organize your colleagues to support you.

A union rep is not a lawyer, but they can help you look for legal assistance too.

Do you want to help other students facing those issues?

This work is only possible through grad workers volunteering their time and experience. **Ask about joining the Contract Enforcement Committee, and we'll get you trained and plugged in!**
